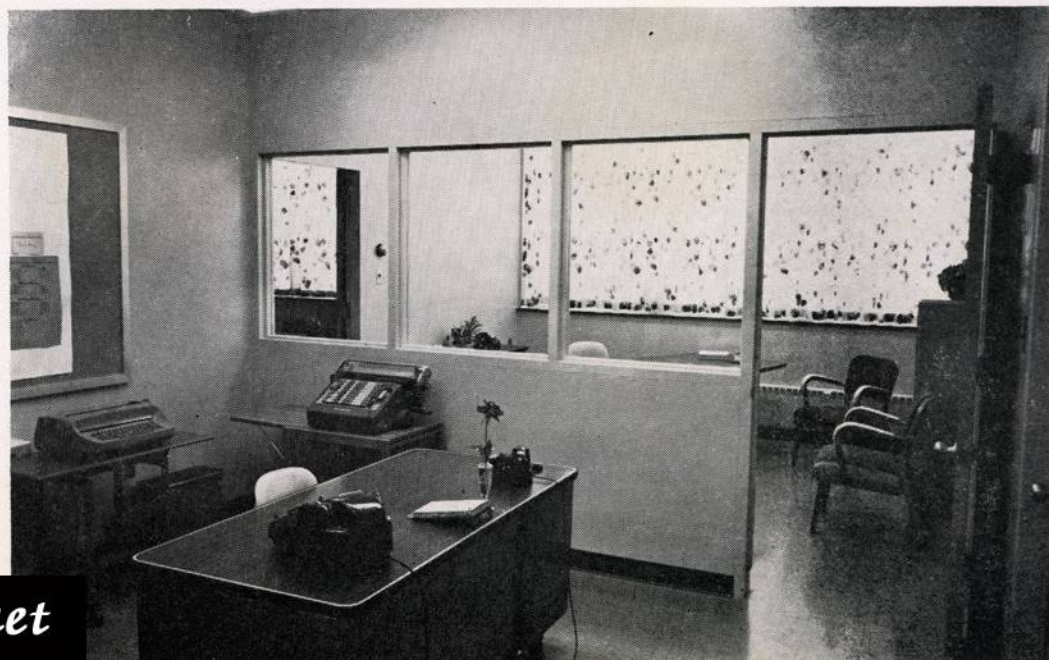

Conference room for Joint Board Committee meetings, staff and faculty workshops, and school related community groups.



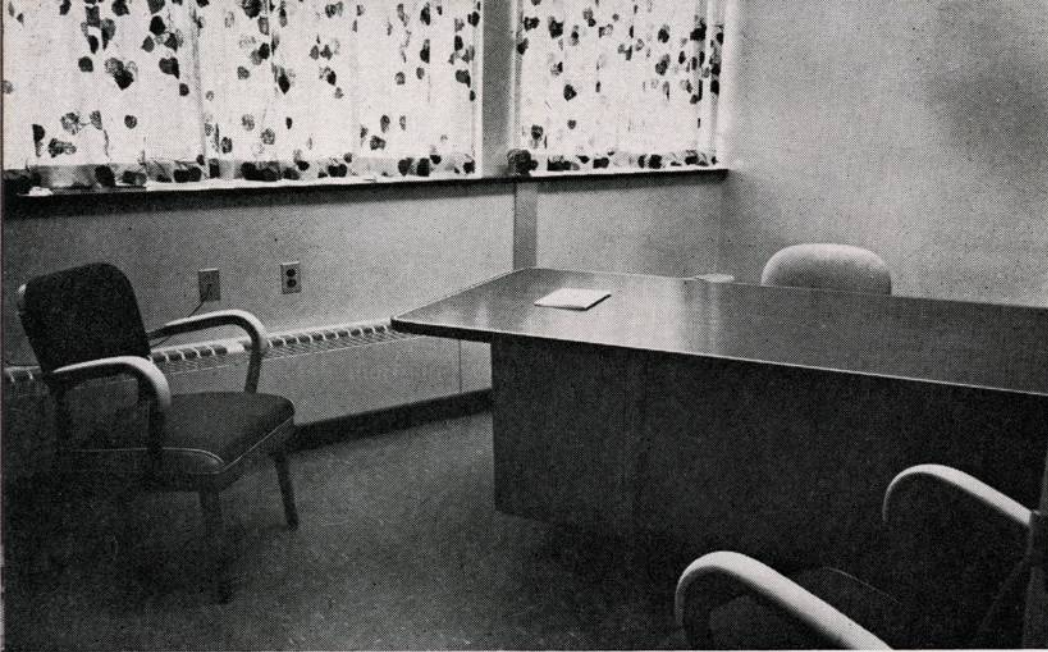
Private office of the supervising principal — chief administrator of the jointure area schools.

Guidance Counselor's office, shares waiting area with school nurse.

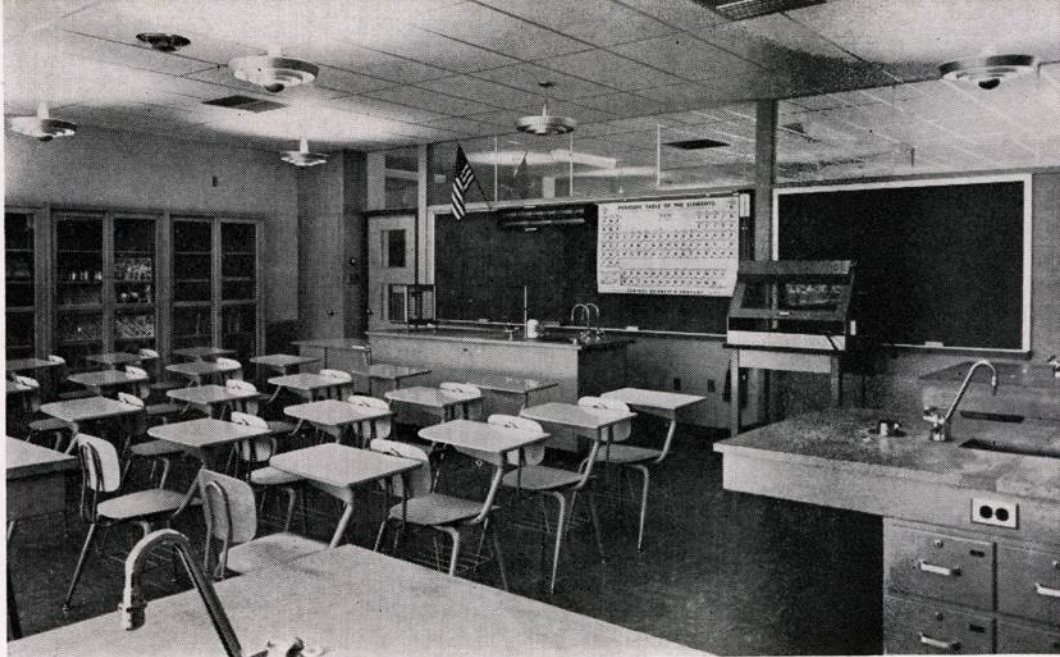


Health suite, with area nurse's office, audiometer and cot rooms, and provisions for physical examinations.

Social studies classroom with trapezoidal furniture and "Mod-uwall". Adapted to small group project and committee work.

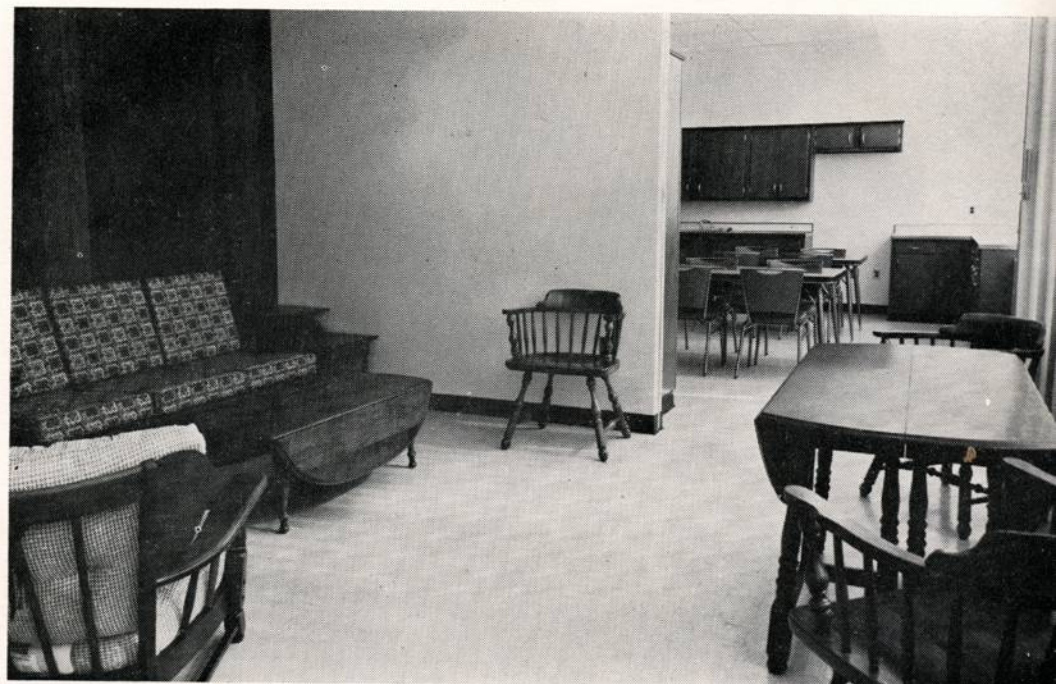

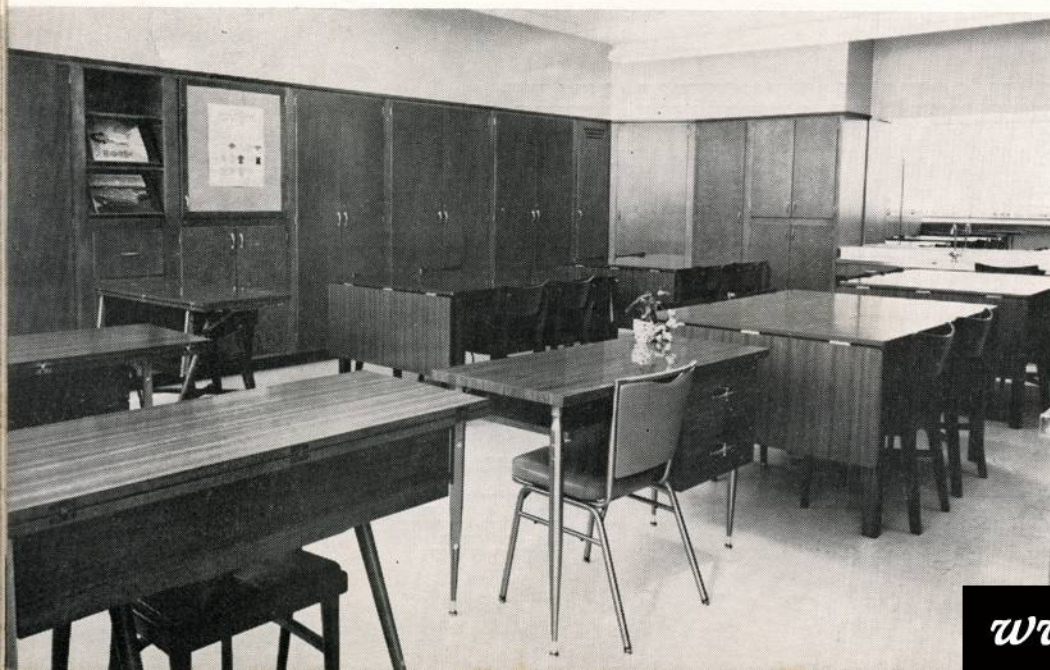

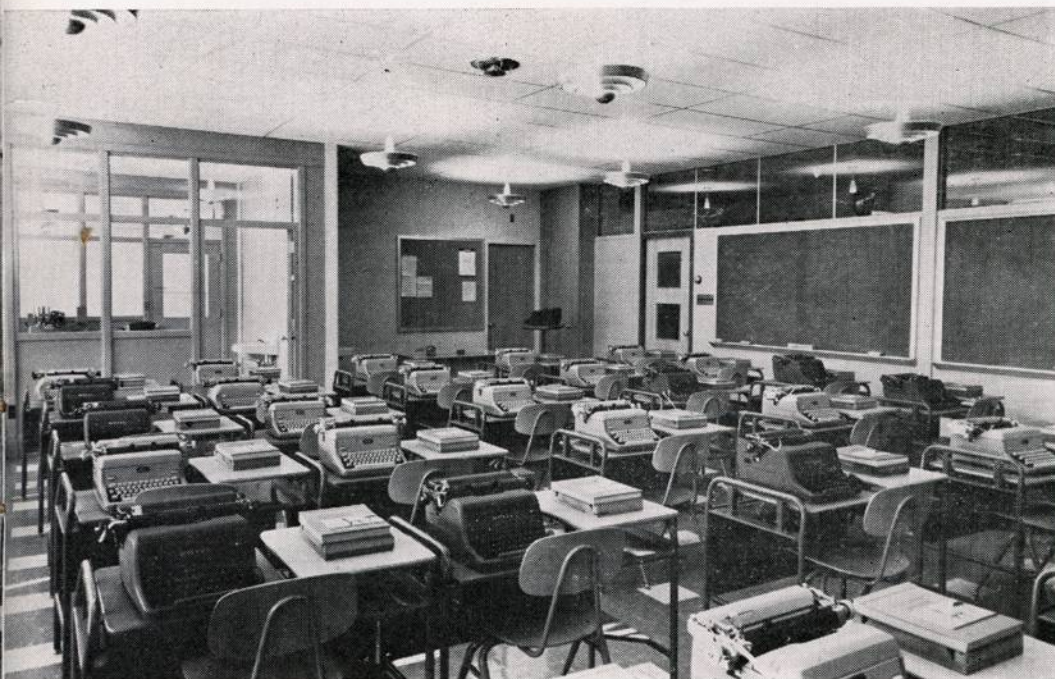
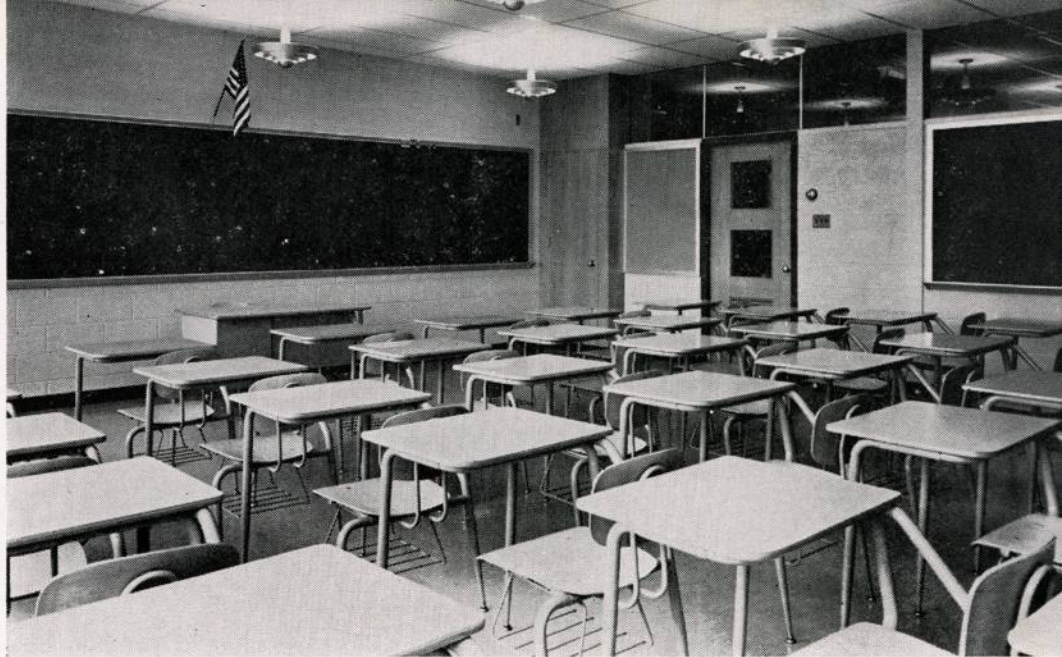


Living area, with adjoining kitchenette - laundry.

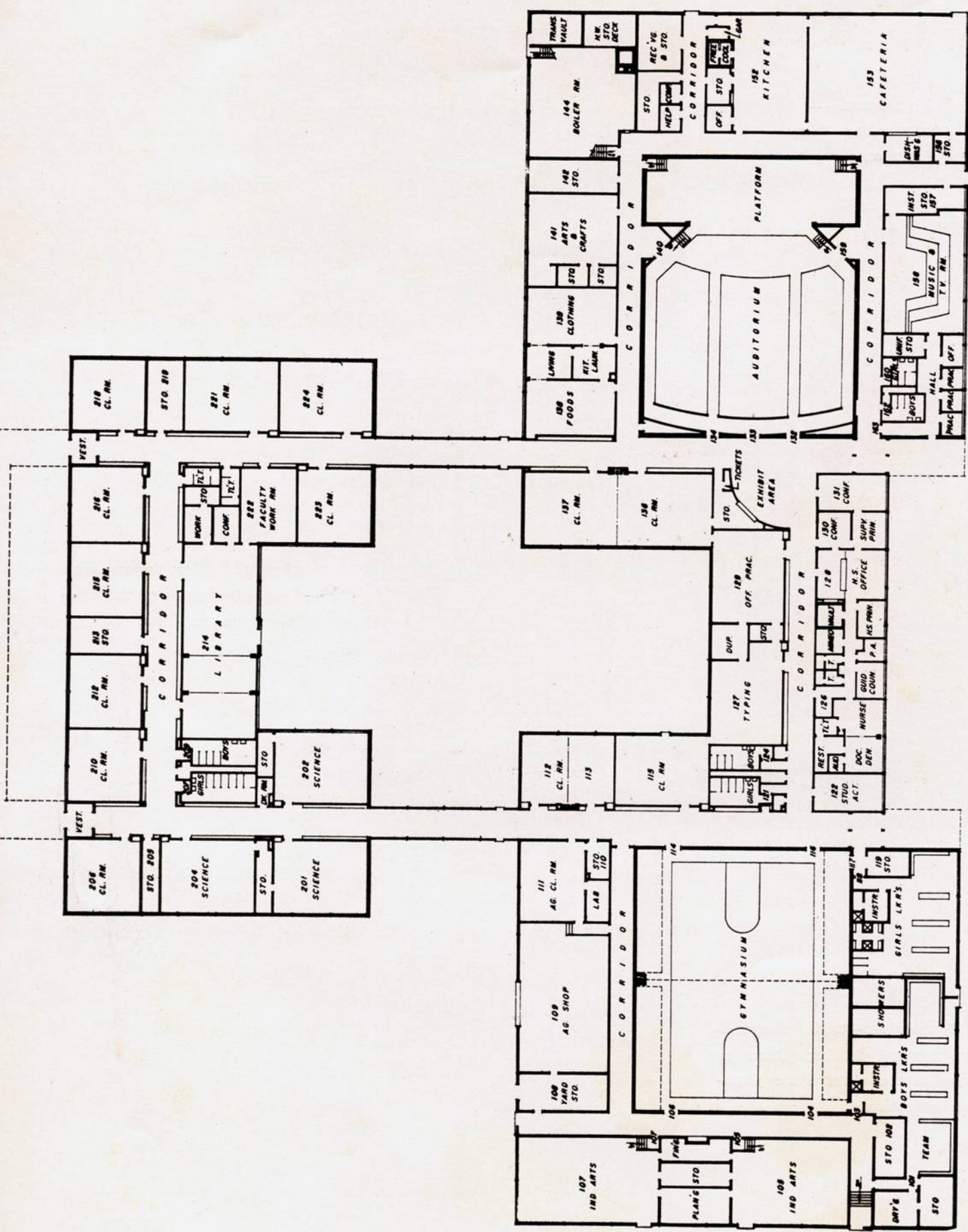

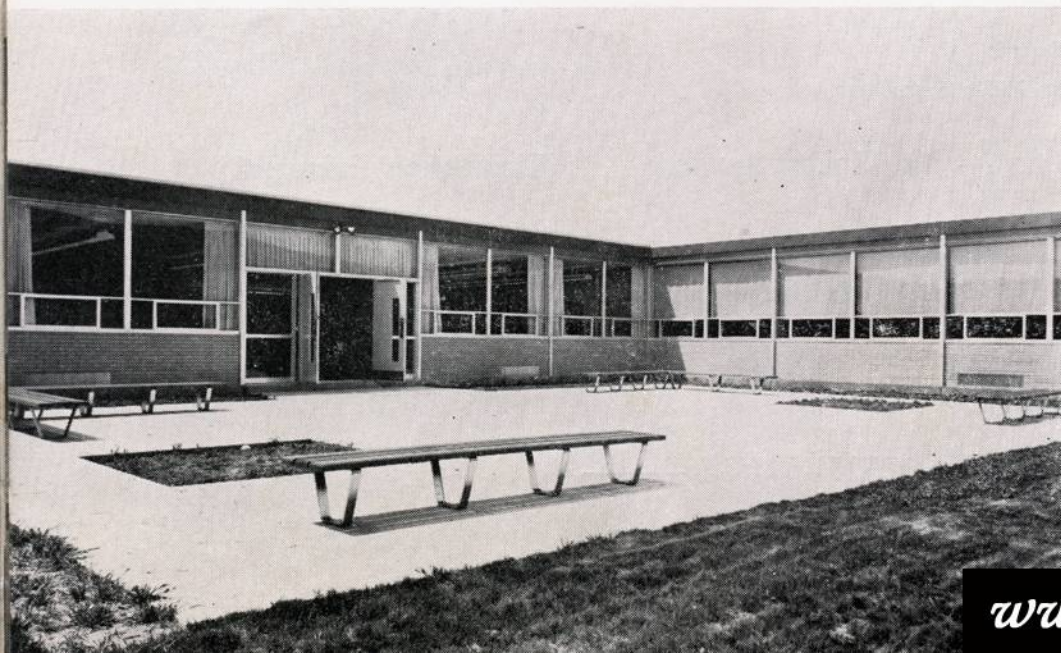

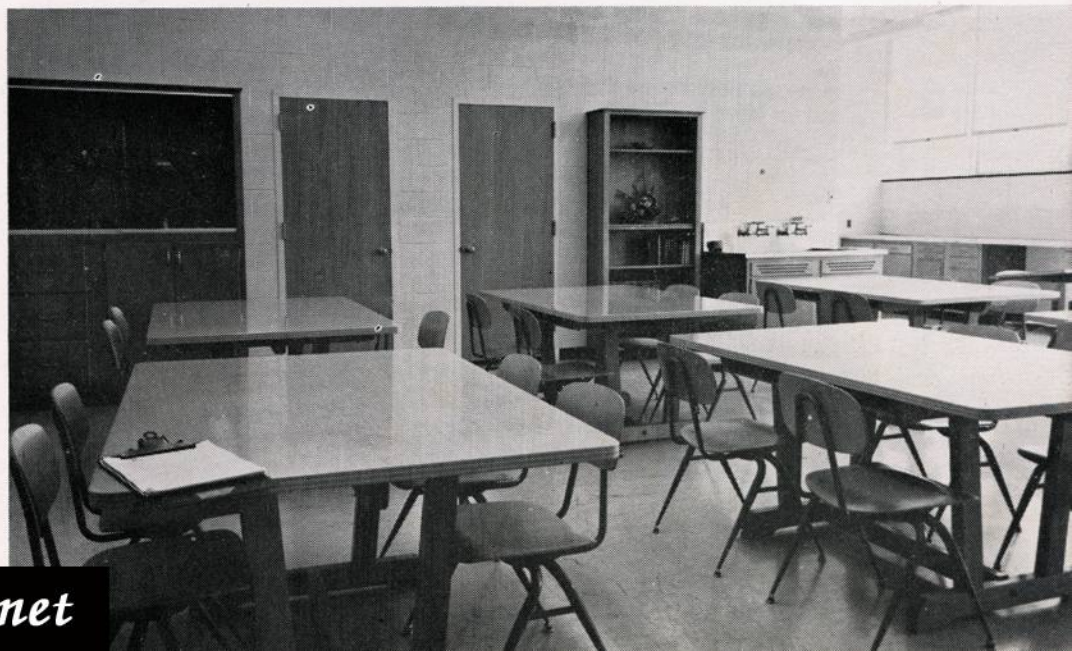
FINE ARTS

Art room—well lighted; includes provisions for project and supply storage, ceramics.

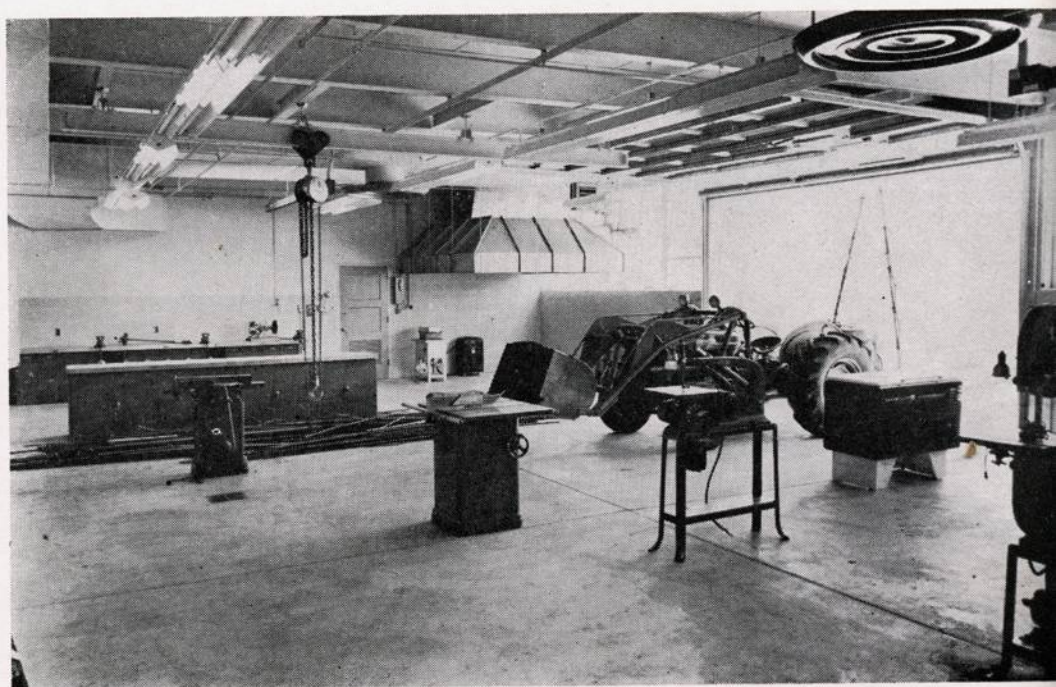

Vocational agriculture classroom with adjoining science laboratory, office, and shop.

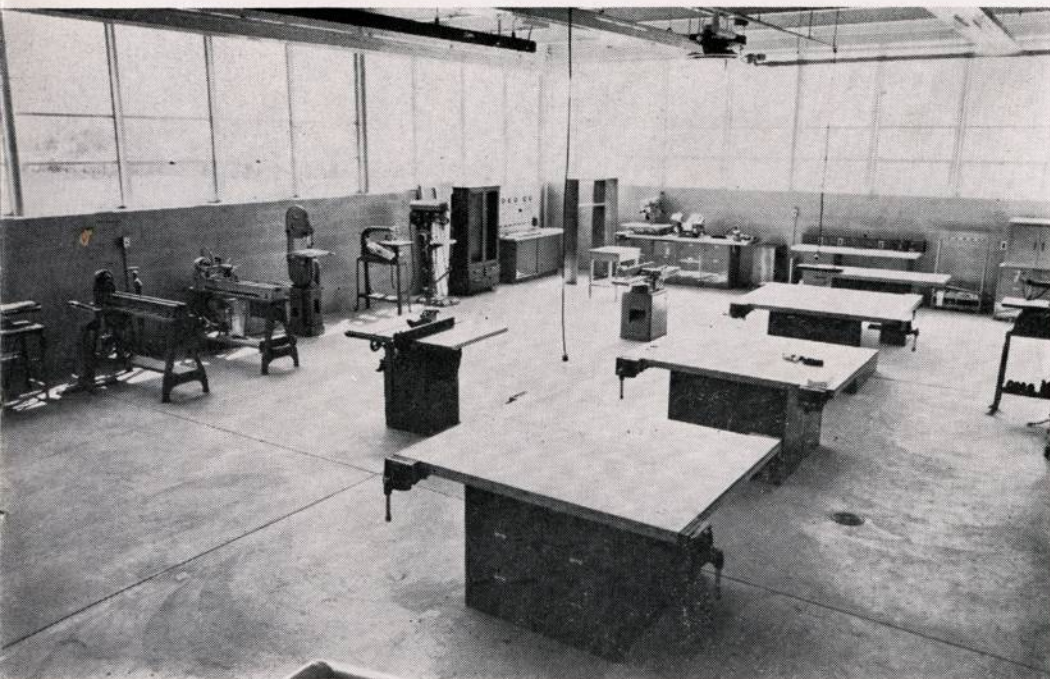
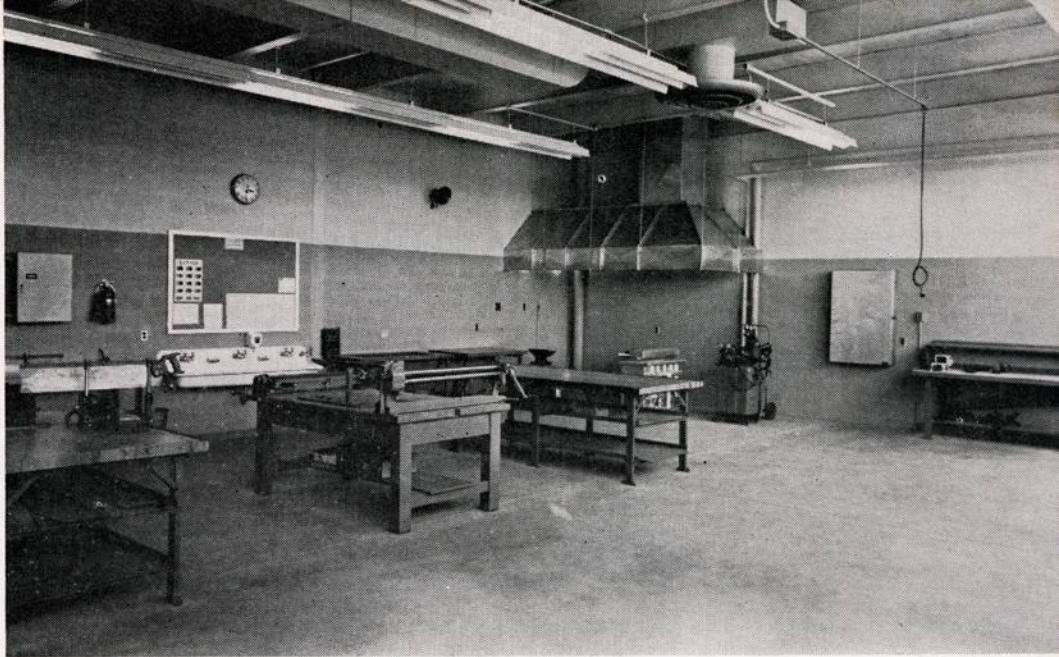
Machine and farm shop area.



Outdoor view — farm shop and heavy machine work area.

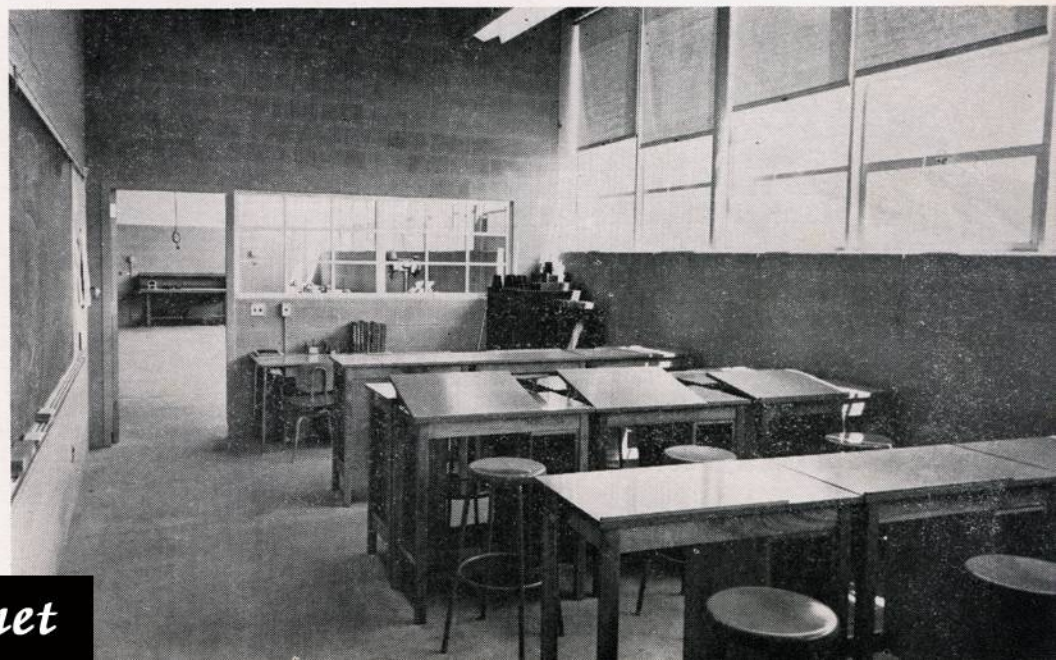

Wood and electrical shop

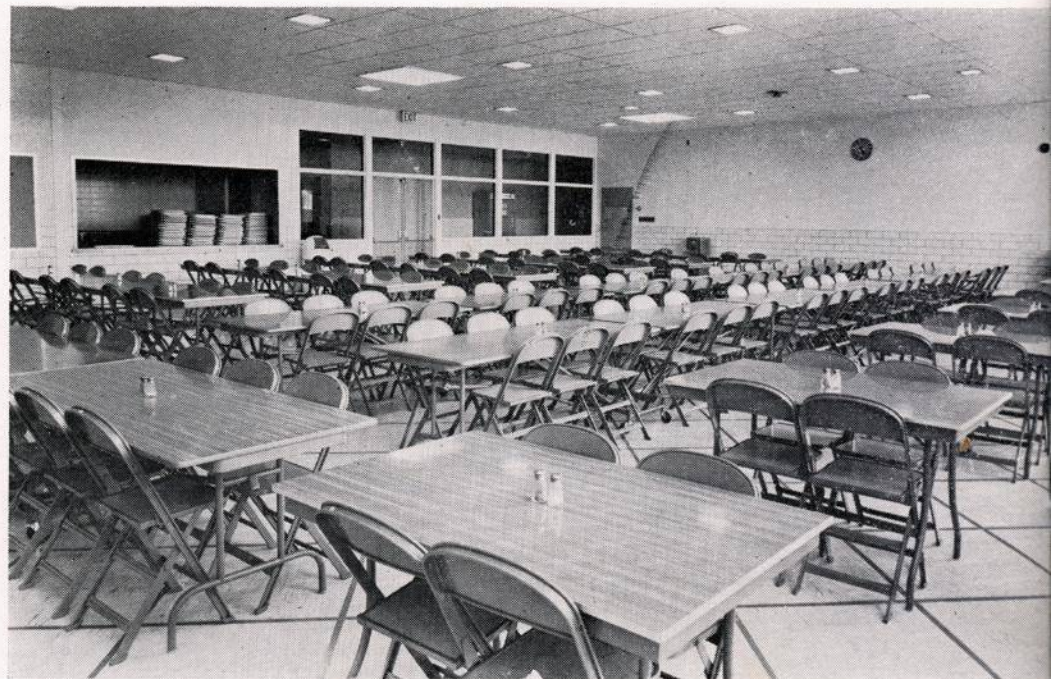
Planning and mechanical drawing room connecting wood and metal shops.

July 18, 1961—Construction bids opened.

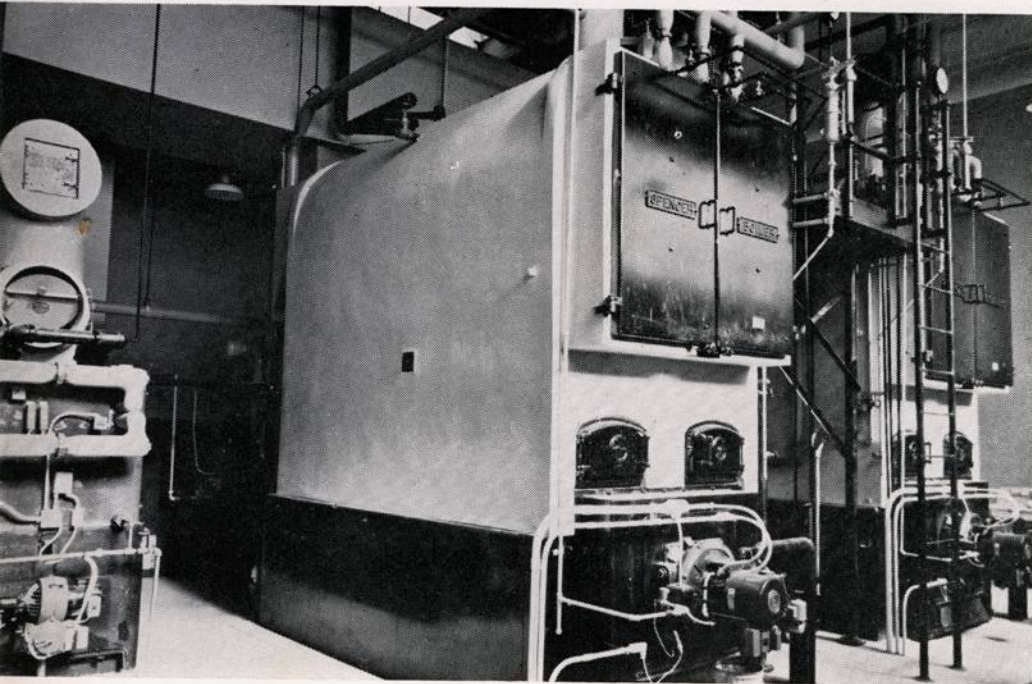
September 3, 1961—Groundbreaking.

June 9, 1963—Dedication.

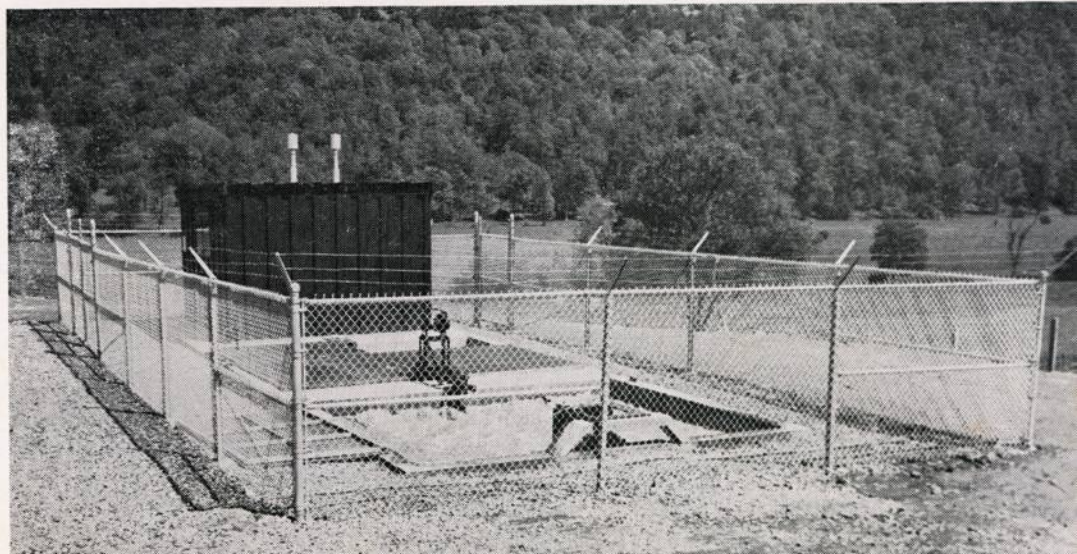

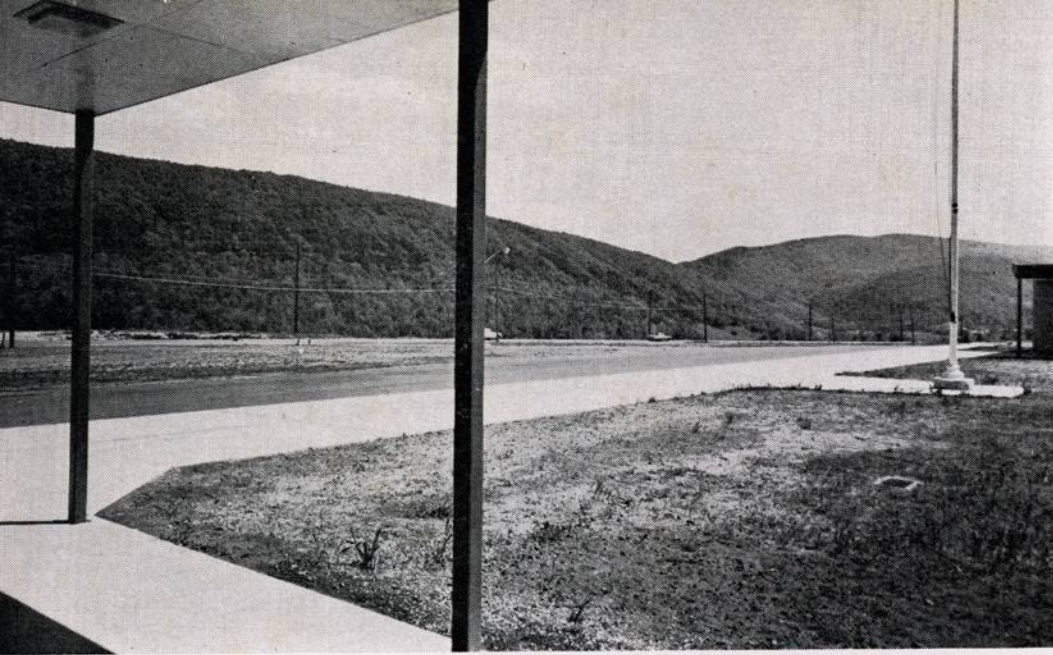


Twin boiler units, oil fired,

Sewage disposal plant, including chlorinator, pumps, and aeration tanks.



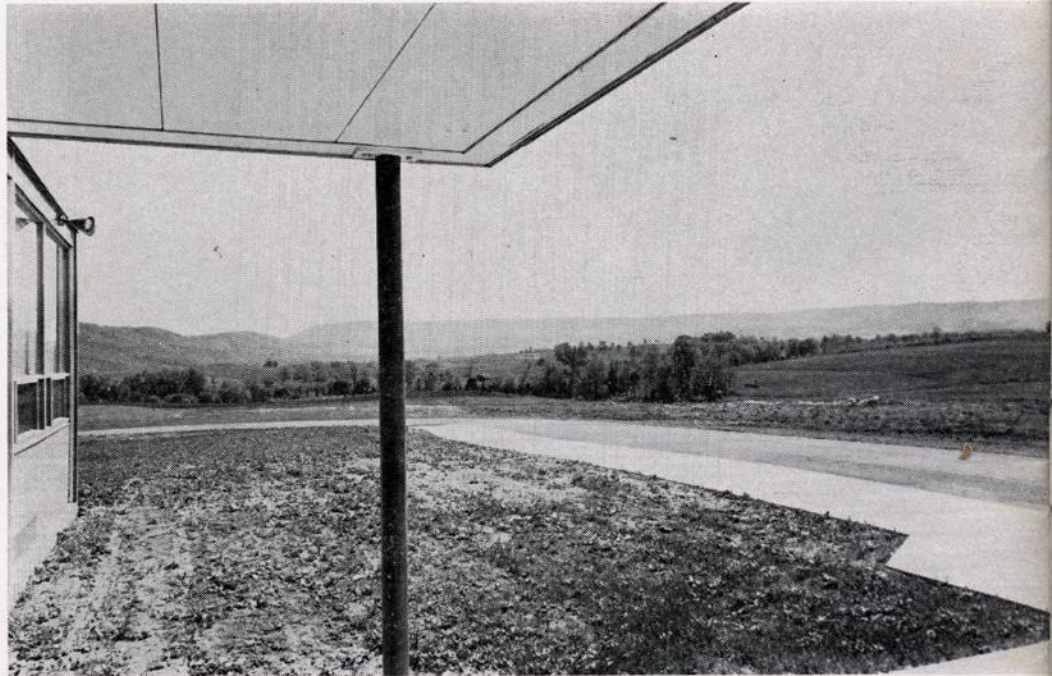
